If you're currently enrolled in an eligible graduate program, have native or near-native proficiency in Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, and other languages, and would like to work with bicultural children in a diverse school setting, we want to help you finish your graduate work and start your rewarding career as a bilingual speech therapist.

The Bilingual Therapies scholarship awards \$2,500 per semester, paid monthly, up to a maximum of \$5,000 to qualified students. The application process includes a personal interview and requires submitting a short essay, personal information sheet and current resume. Recipients awarded a scholarship are required to work for Bilingual Therapies full-time for one year after successfully completing their Master's degree.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

When should I submit my scholarship application?

Scholarship applications are accepted throughout the year.

What can I use scholarship funds for?

The Bilingual Therapies scholarship is paid monthly and may be used for any school related expenses associated with your ASHA-accredited graduate program. This includes tuition, books and other materials, and living expenses.

Do I have to attend a specific university to apply for the Bilingual Therapies scholarship?

To be considered for a scholarship, all applicants must attend an ASHA-accredited graduate program.
