PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The School of Speech, Language, and Hearing Sciences at San Diego State University (SDSU), offers a Master of Arts (MA) degree program in speech-language pathology, accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology (CAA). The program's focus is on educating the finest SLPs in the United States, broadly trained in all clinical practices, and educated in basic and applied research perspectives of the communication sciences and disorders.

Students have access to outstanding faculty and research programs, specialized clinical faculty, and state-of-theart speech, language, and hearing clinics. Clinical experiences with clients of all ages, ethnicities, and disorders are provided for all students. Students are able to take advantage of numerous internship facilities including hospitals, private clinics, public schools, and other community agencies that serve the greater San Diego area.

Students proficient in Spanish may opt to complete the Bilingual Certificate Program, which includes additional coursework and 100 clinical hours with Spanish-English bilingual clients. Students proficient in a second language other than Spanish may complete the Bilingual Specialization Program.

GENERAL PROGRAM OF STUDY

The program of study prepares students for careers in a wide range of environments including public schools, hospitals, and clinics and to work with individuals with various disorders across the lifespan. Strengths of the program include: a) an emphasis in working with clients from culturally and linguistically-diverse backgrounds; b) the SDSU/UCSD joint doctoral programs in Audiology and in Language and Communicative Disorders enhance the educational experiences for students seeking the master's degree; c) opportunities for laboratory rotations with some of the top speech, language, and hearing researchers in the country; and d) the School's longstanding relationship with schools, hospitals, and other community agencies in Southern California.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The gradate program is five semesters of full-time study (two academic years with an intervening summer). Those whose undergraduate degrees are in another discipline must complete the prerequisites prior to beginning the SDSU program.

The mandated curriculum consists of coursework adequate in breadth and scope to prepare students for the Certificate of Clinical Competence (ASHA), California licensure in SLP, and the Speech-Language Pathology Credential from CTC [in Language, Speech, and Hearing (LSH)]. Forty-five units of required academic courses comprise the basis of all programs of study; 9 of these units comprise electives (for example: thesis, laboratory rotations, seminars). An additional 19 units of clinical practicum and internships in both adult and school settings are required. Students may choose between a comprehensive examination or a thesis to complete requirements for graduation.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants for admission to the MA program must meet the general requirements for classified graduate standing at San Diego State University. GRE scores and overall undergraduate GPA of 3.2 or greater are required, along with three letters of recommendation from professors, and a student statement of interest.

FUNDING

MA students may apply for various University funds. If funding is available, students in the program can serve as graduate or teaching assistants for courses, research assistants to individual faculty, and/or work in the clinic.
