OTHER GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SLHS MAJORS:

<u>INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE:</u> All SLHS majors are required to participate in an international experience to increase awareness of cross-cultural issues, global health, economic, political, cultural, social services, and health challenges experienced by local populations in international environments. Students participate in residence for a minimum of two weeks. Exemption from the study abroad portion of the requirement must be approved by the dean of the college based on serious and compelling life events or physical limitations; a relevant course and community service activity in the U.S. will be substituted. <u>LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT:</u> As a student receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in Liberal Arts and Sciences you must satisfy the language requirement by demonstrating competency in a language other than English. This competency can be demonstrated by:

- Completion of a third college semester of a fifth college quarter in a language other than English.
- Successfully completing the fourth-year level of high school courses in a language other than English.
- Graduating from a high school (where English is not the major language of instruction) in a non-English speaking country.
- Passing of a language Advanced Placement (AP) examination. For specific passing criteria please see the <u>SDSU</u> course catalog.



REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING UPPER DIVISION COURSES:

- 1. Completion of all preparation for the major courses
- 2. Completion of a minimum of 60 semester units
- 3. Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75
